TSBC Announces Next Five-Year Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Draft Plan 2027-2031

Purpose of this Notice

Tire Stewardship BC (TSBC) is beginning the public consultation process for its next five-year Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Plan. Under British Columbia's Recycling Regulation, stewards are required to review and renew their approved EPR Plans every five years.

These consultations provide an opportunity for interested parties to learn more about the proposed plan and to share comments or suggestions before it is finalized and submitted to the Ministry.

Why We Are Consulting

TSBC's current EPR Plan was approved in late 2024 / early 2025 and is set to expire on **September 19, 2026**. While the tire recycling program itself is not expected to change significantly, this renewal process helps ensure the plan continues to meet regulatory requirements, reflects current conditions, and incorporates updated performance measures and targets where appropriate.

Draft Plan and How to Provide Feedback

The draft EPR Plan will be posted on the TSBC website for public review until June 25th. In addition to participating in a webinar, written comments may be submitted during the consultation period (April 22 to June 30) by email to consultations2026@tsbc.ca.
